Zuma is Artifort's new armchair designed by French designer Patrick Norguet. A soft and inviting, light and ergonomic chair, which was initially designed for offices. With its comfort and low back option it also works well at home.

As Zuma is available with a high and low back, in an active or relax seating position and different bases, it is perfect for workspaces, lounges and at home.



'Zuma is a sister of the Kalm armchair', Norguet explains. 'They have the same clean and expressive lines. Like the Kalm, the cushion is the basis for the design archetype of the Zuma armchair. It connects both parts of the armchair and provides flexibility and comfort. What also makes Zuma stand out, are the armrests made of aluminum casting. They are designed as a sculptural expression of comfort'.



Patrick Norguet

Patrick Norguet (1969, France) made his breakthrough as a designer at the end of the nineteen-nineties. With his sense of colour, formal restraint and elegant purity coupled with character and his continual search for comfort, it's not surprising that he started designing for Artifort in 2002. In this year he designed the characteristic Apollo armchair followed by various successful pieces. Various museums around the world have included products designed by him in their collections. Norguet is also celebrated for designing high-end offices, the Okko hotels and the McDonald's restaurant on the Champs-Élysées in Paris. In 2014, GQ Magazine voted him 'Designer of the Year 2014'.
